Apply by post for a replacement. Download and fill in an application for a log book (V62) . Send it to DVLA with a cheque or postal order for £25 made payable to ' DVLA , Swansea'.

### Get a vehicle log book (V5C) - GOV.UK

Get a replacement provisional or full driving licence online with DVLA if yours gets lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed. This service is also available in Welsh (Cymraeg). You will no longer need...

### Replace a lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed driving ...

The V5C vehicle registration certificate is one of the main documents you will want from the car owner if you're buying a second hand car. Without the V5C, more commonly known as the log book, you may not be able to tax the vehicle, so you won't be able to drive it. A lost log book can easily be replaced.

### How to replace lost car documents - Admiral.com

Send the V62 and required payment to DVLA, Swansea, SA99 1DD. If any of your details have changed you can use section 6 on the V62 to inform DVLA. Expect your registration certificate within a week if you apply by phone or six weeks if you apply by post.

### DVLA lost my documents and won't answer the phone. What ...

The V5C logbook provided by DVLA is not evidence of legal car ownership. Instead, it states the name and address of the registered keeper as the responsible owner or driver of the vehicle. Driver Vehicle Licensing Agency make a clear statement on the V5 logbook stipulating the document is not proof of ownership.

### Who Is the Legal Owner of a Car? (How to Prove Ownership ...

After all, the vehicle logbook is a record of the registered keeper, not proof of ownership. And details can be checked directly from the DVLA database. The V5C or Logbook holds all the ownership info for your vehicle. Once a car has been sold or changed ownership, you can also notify the DVLA without needing the V5 if it's unavailable.

### How To Sell A Car Without A V5C Logbook (2020 Update ...

DVLA will return your licence and identity documents separately, it cannot guarantee to return your identity documents by a set date. If you would like your identity documents returned by special delivery, include a stamped self-addressed special delivery envelope with your application. Keep a note of the serial number.

### **Tell DVLA you've sold, transferred or bought a vehicle ...**

You must renew your right to use your private (personalised) number every 10 years if it's not being used on a vehicle. If you got your private number before 2015, you must renew it more often ...

### **Private (personalised) number plates: Renew or replace ...**

There is a specific process to replace a lost or stolen V750 certificate of entitlement or a lost retention document (V778). You would need to send a letter to DVLA Personalised Registrations to request a replacement. The 'grantee' is the person who has the right to use a registration number.

Apply for a new logbook via DVLA form V62 If you have defaced or lost your vehicle V5C logbook, you can still transfer ownership of your car or sell it to a third party. It's also lawful to do so provided there is no outstanding finance such as a logbook loan or Hire Purchase. The legal owner of a car is the person who bought it.

The V5 document does not actually prove ownership of the vehicle and this is boldly displayed on the front of the V5 document. Ownership of a vehicle is the person or entity that purchased the vehicle and if a vehicle is under a finance arrangement, or a company car then this will be either the finance provider or company, respectively.

Since then, all V5 documents are red, due to the theft of a number of blank certificates in 2006. So the DVLA recommends owners update to the red version, and that's the version now automatically issued.

### **V5C: The Ultimate Guide To Your V5 Log Book (2020 Update ...**

This part of your car document is used for transfer of ownership and existing owner change of name or address. It is mandatory to include the date of sale of the transfer. There are options to include the mileage at the time of sale (DVLA find this information useful as a method to flag car clocking) and/or your driving licence number.
