Early-onset hospital-acquired pneumonia and ventilator-associated pneumonia, defined as infections occurring within the

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first 4 hospital days, tend to be caused by antibiotic-susceptible bacteria, whereas late-onset infections are more frequently caused by multidrug-resistant (MDR) organisms (Table 97-5), which are associated with greater morbidity and mortality.

Hospital-acquired infections can be caused by bacteria, viruses, fungi, or parasites. These microorganisms may already be present in the patient's body or may come from the environment, contaminated hospital equipment, health care workers, or other patients. Depending on the causal agents

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involved, an infection may start in any part of the body.

Environmental cleaning is a fundamental principle of infection prevention in healthcare settings. Contaminated hospital surfaces play an important role in the transmission of dangerous pathogens, including *Clostridium difficile*, and antibiotic-resistant organisms such as methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA) and vancomycin-resistant enterococci (VRE).

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
